FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Hillcrest Elementary School has an enrollment of approximately 475 students in grades K – 5. It is a great school with outstanding teachers, students, and parents and was recognized in 2013-14 as a "Model School" by the state of Oregon. We believe that it takes all of us working together to ensure that our students reach their full potential as learners.

This report card offers a comprehensive picture of the academic performance of Hillcrest for the 2015-16 school year. This year's results are based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments to test student mastery of the rigorous Common Core State Standards. Our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students were tested at the end of last year, and here are some of their academic highlights:

- 98.5% participated in the Smarter Balanced Assessments for the grades tested
- 63.3% met or exceeded the English language arts standards, exceeding the state average by 11%.

- 64.5% met or exceeded the mathematics standards, exceeding the state average by nearly 20%.

Although our academic results surpassed the state averages, we will continue to strive to improve our performance so that all students will achieve at high levels. To reach this goal, we will continue to focus on implementing research-based instructional strategies and common formative assessments aligned to the Common Core State Standards.

You can support your child by emphasizing the importance of completing homework, reinforcing regular attendance, participating in parent-teacher conferences, volunteering at school, and having open communication with staff.

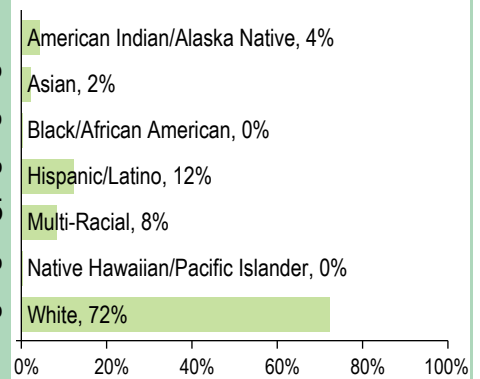

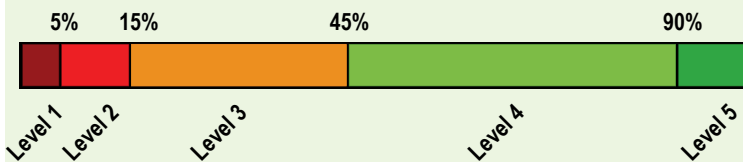
