Dear Parents and Community Members,

North Bay is a fantastic school with great students, teachers and parents! Our staff is committed to making all students and families feel welcome and an integral part of their educational experience. As a school we continue to have an instructional focus on the core content areas of English Language Arts and Math.

This report card offers a comprehensive picture of the academic performance of North Bay for the 2015-2016 school year. This year's results are based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments to test student mastery of the Common Core State Standards. Our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students were tested at the end of last year.

North Bay's academic performance on state assessments for 2015-2016 shows improvement in both English Language Arts and Math as compared to the previous year. The percent of students meeting the ELA requirements grew by 5% and exceeded the Oregon average school performance level and North Bay's like school average. Math scores grew by 3% and were

slightly below the state average school performance level but above North Bay's like school average. Science scores continue to exceed the Oregon average school performance level and North Bay's like school average. Although our academic results show improvement, we continue to strive to increase student learning so all students will achieve at high levels. To reach this goal, we will continue to focus on implementing research-based strategies and common formative assessments aligned to the Common Core Standards.

We will continue to look at individual student performance growth using multiple measures of assessment. Students are making growth due to our strong academic programs and continuous professional development. We look forward to another great year of learning together. 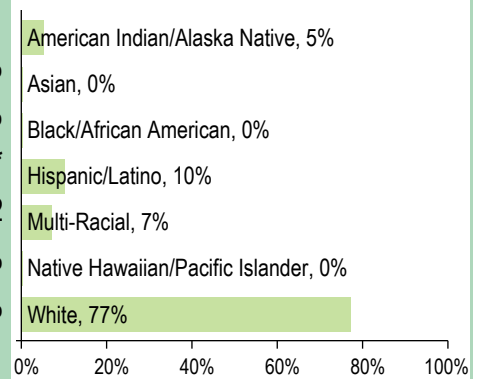

Percent of students without all required vaccines: 4

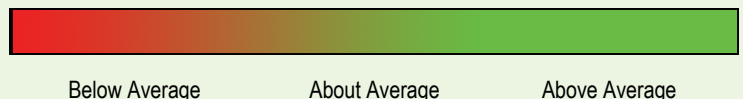
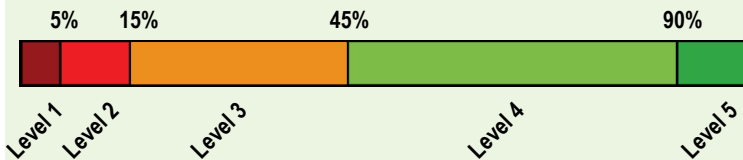
