

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

At North Bend Middle School we continued our trajectory of improved student outcomes in 2015-2016, with double digit increases in the percentage of students proficient in Math and English Language Arts. Our students in grades 6 and 7 receive extended math instruction providing interventions and enrichment. 2016 was the final year of operations for the Oregon Coast Technology School. Students have been merged into the North Bend Middle School student population. In alignment with district goals and the North Bend Promise our teachers are differentiating for students in ELA and Math. Content area teachers emphasize related academic standards and insure ELA instruction and presentation opportunities occur in all subjects.

Teachers work with students to create achievement goals and monitor growth through the year. As the year progresses, teachers meet in teams on a weekly basis to jointly look at student work and plan for interventions and enrichment. To prepare our students to take ownership of their learning in high school and beyond, all classes emphasize the use of Cornell Notes, planners, and goal setting. We conduct student led conferences where digital portfolios are shared with parents.

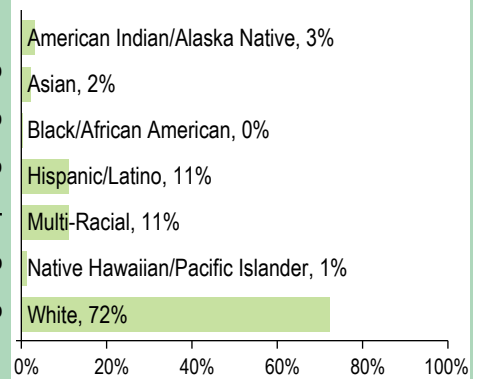

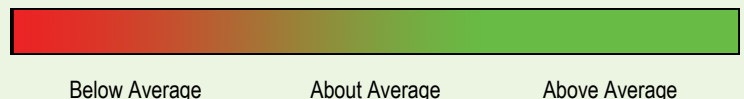
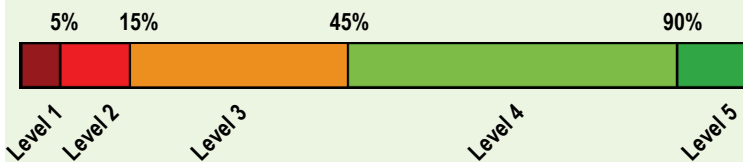
